 - 1 fat quarter or (1) 18" x 20" piece of cotton fabric
 - 18" of 1" grosgrain ribbon
 - Foam batting (Soft and Stable, Flex Foam) at least a 18" x 20" piece
 - Thread to match fabrics
 - Interfacing (if desired for a stiffer basket)
 - Marking pen
 - Rotary cutter and mat
 - 24" quilters ruler

- Cut 5 2 1/2" x 42" strips.
- Cut foam into 18" x 20" rectangle.

Save Our Selvages Sewing Machine Cover

Instructor: Jennifer Klee

Class Fee: \$23 plus optional \$6 bags of selvage strips

Level: All Skill Levels

Description: Sew a colorful custom dust cover for your sewing machine from selvages and/or fabric strips. Fussy cutting sewing theme or fun fabric block can be the focal center of the front or use all strips for your design. Strips applied to a sturdy base fabric is a great way to be creative, use up your selvage stash and protect your machine. The back of the cover may be a fabric piece instead of strips. A bit of machine quilting will compliment your project.

- Basic Sewing Supplies (including machine and machine manual)
- 10-20yds of selvage edge strips or fabric strips -1"-2" wide; varied widths work well. 6" minimum length suggested but shorter pieces can be sewn together.
- Optional focus block in center sample photo is
 5 1/2" square; may be size of your choosing.
- 3/4 yd fusible fleece optional but recommended
- 3/4 yd lining fabric optional: can be used for a portion of the back cover
- 1/2 package of double fold bias tape or make your own; can use wider selvage strips too
- 1 1/2" yds 3/4"-1" ribbon for side ties or make your own from selvage edges, bias tape, fabric, etc.





Save Our Selvages Sewing Machine Cover **Cutting Instructions**

(to be completed prior to class)

If the machine cover you are making is not for the machine you will be using in the class -- obtain the following measurements and bring with you to class:

- Width
- Bottom/front base over the top to the back base

Once prepped, you're ready for a great time piecing together this bold and beautiful star! Let's dive in and create something stunning together.

Rolling Stones



Class Fee: \$72 (includes class, pattern, and packet of stabilizer)

Level: All Skill Levels

Description: Get out of the way!! Here comes the Rolling Stones String Quilt Pattern. It's Frisky's latest String Quilt. No need to get all "strung out" making this quilt. Janie and I will share lots of tips for making each of three types of blocks and then assembling them to make your beautiful quilt. Sign up and enjoy the day with other String Quilt enthusiasts. Students will learn how to make the three types blocks used in the Rolling Stones Quilt Pattern. Those include solid string blocks with diagonal strings, half square triangle blocks with diagonal strings, and solid square blocks with straight strings. While making these blocks, the students will learn how to mark specific areas of the stabilizer for keeping their strings aligned and for squaring up.

- Ultra fine tip permanent marker (red or black)
- 1/4" foot with guide
- Frixion Ink Pen
- 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" square-up ruler

Description: This cute variation of a Tee shirt Quilt is a little something different. It makes a great gift for graduation or birthdays. I called mine Dancing Tees! It is fun to make and can be completed with borders to make it larger.

- Basic Sewing Supplies (including machine and machine manual)
- · 20 tee shirts with logos
- · Frame Material 2 yards
- Contrasting Frame Material 2 1/2 yards (If you do not want to use contrasting fabric, then you needed 5 yards of the same fabric for the frames around the tee shirts)
- Inner border (if desired) -1/2 yard
- Outer boarder (if desired) 2 yards
- Binding 3/4 yard
- Backing 5 1/4 yards
- 931TD Medium Weight Fusible Interfacing (or Craft Bond in Midweight) 8 yards (not the type used for applique)



Twisted Tee-Shirt Quilt Cutting Instructions

Tee Shirts must be deconstructed - sleeves, shoulders and necks cut off. It is ok to leave the body of the shirt into a tube .

Never Fear New York Beauties

Description: This is a fun class making an old time favorite quilt block using modern techniques, templates and fun fabrics. The more fun fabrics, the better. This quilt is a great way to use leftover fabrics. Focus more on color than fabric pattern. The techniques learned in this class are useful in making other patterns.







Students are encouraged to follow Pat's in-class instructions rather than the magazine's rewrite. Quilt size 72 x 72 inches

Supplies:

- Basic Sewing Supplies (including machine and machine manual)
- Straight ruler and cutting board of at least 20 inches.
- 3/4 yards of 8 different fabrics. The 8 fabrics should include 2 darks, 5 graduated colors, one feature fabric (bright)

The pattern can be made in any color combination. One stand-out fabric (bright or strong contrast) makes the pattern most dramatic.



CharmGello Nebula Twist Cutting Instructions

Cut each fabric into five inch strips by WOF

Take a colorful jelly roll or 8 quarter yard cuts, add a striking accent fabric, and then select a background fabric for a throw-sized quilt that is so pretty, you will think you've found paradise!

Supplies:

- Basic Sewing Supplies (including machine and machine manual)
- Paradise Found quilt pattern
- Strip Tube Ruler by Cozy Quilt Designs
- Fabric requirements for the throw size quilt (64" x 64") as indicated on the pattern. If the student does not want to purchase the strip tube ruler, they can bring an 8-1/2" or larger square ruler. Instructions will be given on how the pattern can be altered to sew and cut the strips using a square ruler. Rotary cutter and mat. Small iron and ironing board/mat will be useful.


